In 2024, the Department of Health issued a report that stated that, It recorded that about one in four girls are experiencing teenage pregnancy. Not only is it becoming a concern, but it is also becoming a crisis for our communities. Our teenagers have outgrown the responsibility to be children leading them to grow up a lot faster than they should. Their overall behaviour is becoming a concern. Not only have we identified challenges, but we have also found out there are many circumstances leading to the demotivation of staying in school.

The most common of these challenges are behavioural challenges.

Considering that there are family systems that contribute to these challenges, Our teenagers are in a position where they can analyze situations, they feel the need and the responsibility to take control. This affects their well-being. They end up not seeing the importance of staying in school.

An intervention is needed to help bring about the change that we seek the support that they need.

Empowering Teens: Ongoing Behavioral Support and Development Program

### Introduction

We want to help keep teenagers in school, with the challenges faced by teens in our communities we felt there was a need for community education amongst youth. We want to create a supportive environment were teens can thrive.

Our project is for teenagers, as a organisation we do not only support their growthbut also support in making sure that they are motivated stay in school. We have one benefitiary school and we also do community outreach.

We do school visits, Host teen clubs one Surtuday a month. a school holiday program that includes workshops and school holiday tours as part of our community outreach. We require support to make our impact a possibility and we will be needing support, financially and with resources. This year our Budget for the school holiday program is R10000 which will be covering the cost of materials, refreshments and travel. Through our the school closing term of June - July 2025.

We will then identify children needing the most support, those that orphaned and coming from child headed households, by seeking support and doing referrals to get them the support they may need.

Prevent risky behaviors like substance abuse, truancy, and delinquency by promoting self-awareness and self-discipline.

Foster academic success by helping teens develop strong time-management and goal-setting skills.
